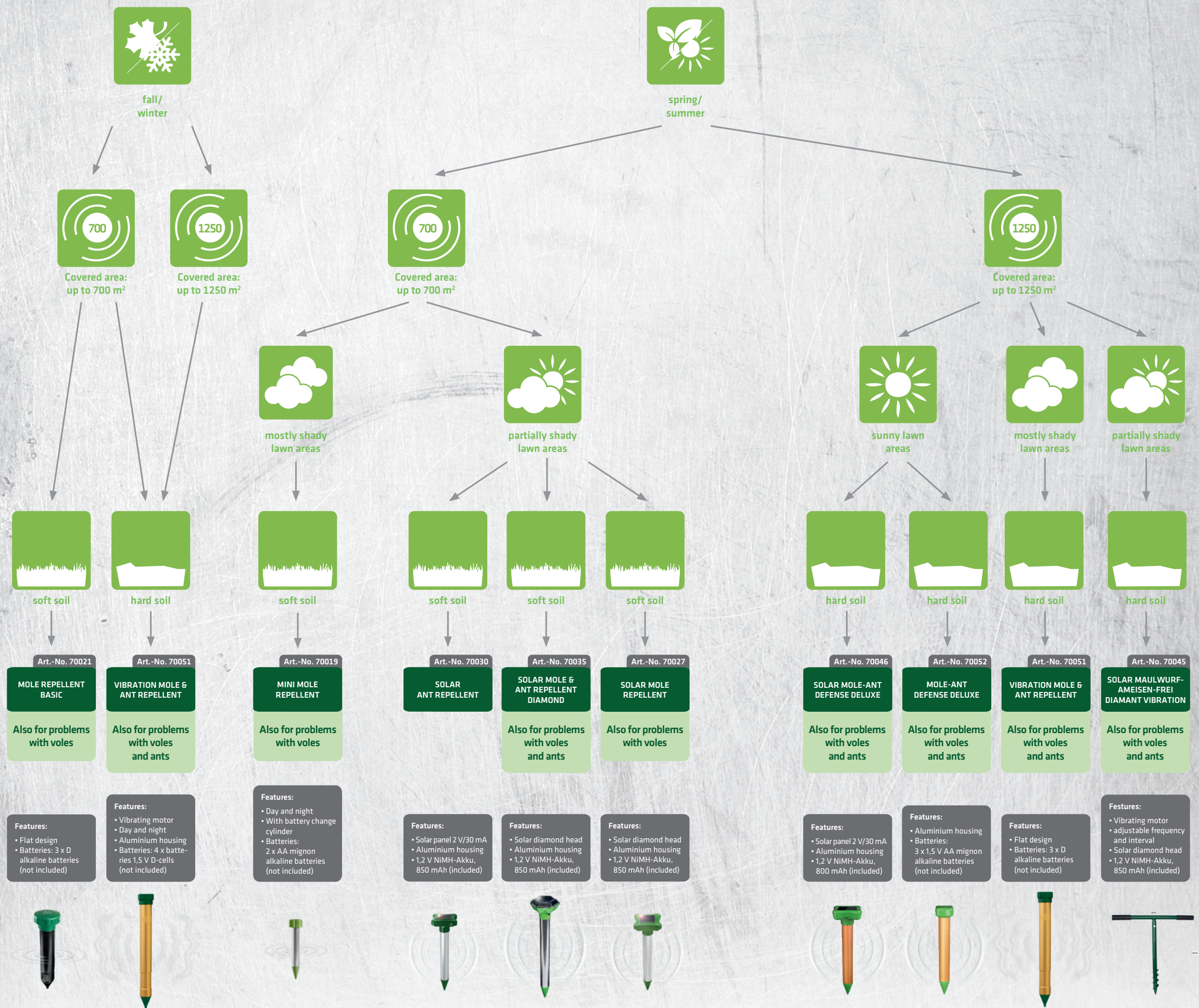


# How to find your matching product!



## Technical functionality

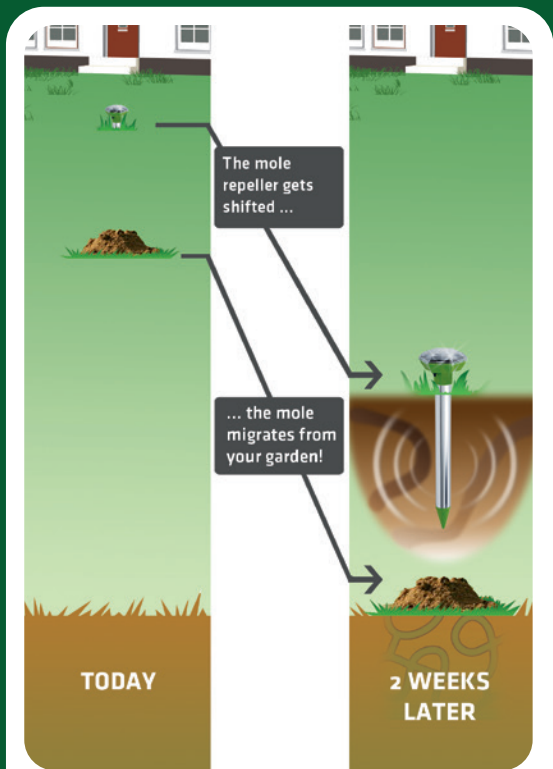
To permanently deter a mole from your property, it is critical to keep in mind the following instructions:

Moles should be driven away from buildings in the direction of the property line. To achieve this, place one or several mole repellers close to the house. They must be placed in between the house and the closest mole hill.

Move the repellers closer to the plot boundaries as needed - usually in a two week rhythm. If the molehills haven't moved after three weeks, please check if the device is turned on and functioning correctly (the emitted tone is audible). If it is indeed turned on, turn off the device for a day or two to make sure the mole is not getting used to the tone. Different periods of time until the effect sets in may have various causes. Some moles can be more persistent than others and the soil may contain sand, turf or clay.

If you need to dig a hole to set the device into the ground, please remember to press on the earth to make it as dense as it was before. The looser the soil, the worse it can transmit the sound and vibration our devices emit. Solar powered devices have an integrated on/off switch. They are meant to be powered off every now and then to not allow the mole to get used to the noise. If you are using a battery powered device, simply take out the battery cylinder.

When you start using a mole repeller it is perfectly normal to see an increased mole activity at first, causing even more molehills than before. As the mole notices a change in its environment, it tries to find out what causes it. In the long run, this change is annoying and the animal will relocate to a quieter place.



Please do not put the repeller directly into the molehill. Turn it off or pull it out periodically to avoid a habituation effect.
